Feedback received from parents that participated in the Summer, 2019 National PTA Parent Focus Group taught us that along with students, transitioning parents also need some additional support.

So much information is available on school websites. However, the breadth of information can be overwhelming.

The Tool Kit seeks to streamline the information for parents and provide links.

Some of our parents, including our international parents, have particular challenges we may take for granted:

- Navigating transitions from Elementary to Middle or Middle to High school to set yourself up for success is complex: Parents too need to learn the academic landscape: basic key terms, critical deadlines, and understanding the various post HS paths available to their kids.
- Families new to this country will be facing a completely new culture on many fronts, including in school: academic, but also the big role of sports, school dances, school spirit.
- The US's idea of encouraging independence in schools, particularly when entering middle school, may be a new concept culturally— a little explanation could go a long way.

1.WHAT IS DIFFERENT Elementary School



Curriculum – all subjects taught in one classroom with one teacher:

Student responsibilities:

- Students develop goals with the teacher and discuss at Parent teacher conference
- Teachers send regular emails with updates on classwork and assignments.
- Parents communicate with teachers regarding missing classes, assignments, grading questions, etc.

Student clubs: Most clubs are PTSA run

<u>Parent involvement</u>: Teacher's aide, Room parent, Art docent, etc.

Volunteer opportunities: Many PTSA run clubs

Middle School

Curriculum: different subjects with different teachers, students move between periods
Some courses are <u>electives</u>
Schools issue individual netbooks for kids

Student responsibilities:

- Students develop and manage their goals with guidance from the teachers
- Parents can request a meeting with a teacher for some specific needs but direct communication from students in encouraged.
- Students work with counselors for their needs

Student initiated clubs: process? How can students form a club?

ASB and other student Leadership activities?

<u>Parent Involvement</u>: As requested during the year, Chairing PTSA clubs, helping at Socials, etc.

WHAT TO EXPECT? 2. PARENT — SCHOOL COMMUNICATION -



Communication Methods:

Curriculum Night – opportunity to meet each of your student's teachers and visit the classroom

No preset Parent Teacher Conferences in middle school

Email Communication with teacher – regular updates via email is not typical although this can vary add possible frequency

Asking for a Teacher meeting - add process (may be teacher specific)

Meeting with a student counselor – what possible scenarios would need such a meeting?

Additional resources for Emotional support – does the School have a specific teacher working on SEL, add links for more resources

Principal's newsletter – add when to expect

Coffee with the Principal – what is discussed typically? Who attends?


- Course registration and scheduling

8. PARENT INVOLVEMENT & VOLUNTEERING

Some of these happen at the beginning of the school year and include:

Some clubs, such as Science club, Drama or Robotics offer opportunities to parents with specific interests or skill sets to participate. Also music class trips always need parents to join in.

There are also <u>many roles and specific PTA events</u> that count on parent support. note some of these your PTA roles
