



LWPTSA Council 2020-2021 Scholarship Applications

Dear Students:

The Lake Washington PTSA Council is accepting applications for its annual scholarship awards. These scholarships will be awarded to selected graduating seniors from LWSD high schools. Lake Washington PTSA Council Scholarships may be used to pay for anything billed by the university, including tuition, room and board, and other fees. It also includes payment for books and computers, with a receipt. We are not able to reimburse for furniture.

Information about the Scholarships

All student scholarships are \$1,250. Students may apply for multiple scholarships, however a maximum of one scholarship will be awarded per student.

- **Award A: L.E. Scarr 2 year, Vocational, or Technical school Scholarship:** One scholarship to a student planning on attending a two-year or technical college. **(1 award)**
- **Award B: Merit Scholarship:** For students planning on attending a four-year institution. Two merit scholarships to two candidates residing in each of the 4 LWSD Learning Communities (Eastlake, Juanita, Lake Washington, Redmond). Tesla STEM, ICS, and Emerson students will be considered in the learning community in which they reside. **(8 awards)**
- **Award C: LWEA/Teeley Scholarship:** One scholarship to a student entering the field of education. **(1 award)**
- **Award D: Turn Around Scholarship:** One scholarship to a student who has demonstrably turned their academic career around. This scholarship will be awarded to a student who did not perform at their best in the early years of their high school career but "turned around" their situation and can demonstrate a significant improvement in their academic achievement over the course of their high school career. This award is for students planning on attending a two-year or four-year institution. **(1 award)**
- **Award E: Perseverance Scholarship:** Two scholarships to students who have overcome a hardship in life. This scholarship will be awarded to students who are a well-rounded community member and can show excellence in their life and their academics in the face of hardships or a challenging life circumstance. This award is for students planning on attending a two-year or four-year institution. **(2 awards)**
- **At-Large Scholarship:** In 2021, the scholarship committee may choose to award 1 additional "At Large" Scholarship from the entire pool of applicants. **(1 award)**

Applications are due by noon, Thursday, March 25, 2021

Recipients will be notified and winners posted on our web site in mid-May. Recipients will be honored at the LWSD School Board meeting on June 7, 2021, or at another appropriate event.

Instructions for Applicants

The following requirements must be met for your application to be accepted. Failure to follow complete instructions, or submittal of incomplete applications will result in automatic disqualification.

1. Complete the Student Scholarship Application, Questions, and Essay (not needed for Award A). If you are applying for more than one scholarship, please submit one entire application for each scholarship. Questions and essays can be reused as appropriate.
2. Request two letters of recommendation to be sent to scholarships@lwptsa.net via you or directly via the writer. One should be from a faculty member at your high school. The other may be from an employer, family friend, or other appropriate individual. *Letters of recommendation from members of your immediate family are not acceptable.* You may use a letter of recommendation written for other applications.
3. Email the following components to scholarships@lwptsa.net by the deadline:
 - Completed** "2021 Student Scholarship Application Form" as a PDF file. Using print to PDF will ensure the application retains your changes.
 - Answers to Questions and Essay for the relevant prompts** (no essay necessary for Award A). Please save and submit as a single PDF file per scholarship you are applying for.
 - A copy of your high school transcript **that includes first semester grades of your senior year.** By submitting your application and transcript to us, you are issuing us permission to verify your grade report with your school.
 - Your two letters of recommendation unless the teacher/reference will send it directly to us.
4. Include only information specifically requested on the application form and these instructions. **DO NOT include resumes, notebooks, folders, photos, portfolios, etc. Also, DO NOT add your name to every page of your application.**

Applications must be received via email by **noon, Thursday, March 25, 2021.**

APPLICATIONS NOT RECEIVED ON TIME OR INCOMPLETE WILL BE DISQUALIFIED

Important Information: In the event a recipient has not used the scholarship money at a college, university, or vocational school of their choice by **January 31, 2022**, the PTSA Scholarship award amount will remain in the LWPTSA Council Scholarship fund. If unusual circumstances prevent the use of the award in the allotted time, you must contact the Lake Washington PTSA Council prior to **January 31, 2022.**

L.E. Scarr award will be given to a student that is planning on attending 2 year, technical or vocational school. No essay is required.

2. List your activities in the community (include non-paid work experience, volunteer, church, family obligations, clubs, etc.) Please include approximately how many hours per month was spent on each and for what years you participated.
3. If you have had a job(s), please list your employer(s), dates of employment, job responsibilities and approximate number of hours worked.
4. List awards, honors, and/or other special achievements.
5. If there is any other information of which you would like the scholarship committee to be aware, please include a brief description.

Questions: Please concisely answer the following questions; use no more than two (2) typed pages total to answer all five (5) questions.

1. List your activities and interests in high school (ASB, Music, Sports, Clubs, etc.). Please include approximately how many hours per month was spent on each and for what years you participated.
2. List your activities in the community (include non-paid work experience, volunteer, church, family obligations, clubs, etc.) Please include approximately how many hours per month was spent on each and for what years you participated.

A hardship can be any obstacle that the student feels has impacted their life: financial hardship, illness/health issues, substance abuse, challenging family situation, etc. This award is for students planning on attending a two-year or four-year institution.

Questions: Please concisely answer the following questions. Use no more than two (2) typed pages total to answer all five (5) questions.

1. List your activities and interests in high school (ASB, Music, Sports, Clubs, etc.). Please include approximately how many hours per month was spent on each and for what years you participated.
2. List your activities in the community (include non-paid work experience, volunteer, church, family obligations, clubs, etc.) Please include approximately how many hours per month was spent on each and for what years you participated.
3. If you have had a job(s), please list your employer(s), dates of employment, job responsibilities and approximate number of hours worked.
4. List awards, honors, and/or other special achievements.
