Why the shift from 7 to 6 periods?

October 2024, Dr. Holmen announces the decision to move from a 7-period high school day back to a 6-period high school day. The work leading up to this decision began long before.

2015 Lake Washington School District

A Brief History

- 24 credit requirement for class of 2019 goes into effect
- 1,080 instructional hour requirement takes effect
- LWSD forms college and career committee to examine HS start times and 24-credit response

2017 Lake Washington School District

7-Period Day Decision

- Recommendation from
 College and Career
 committee to move to 7 period day
- Also recommend adding 20 minutes to HS day to meet hours requirement
- Was not a strong consensus on 7-period option

7-Period Day

- 2018 2019 school year was the first year of the 7-period high school day
- 20 minutes added to school day same year

2018

Lake Washington

School District

 District removes 1 school day from calendar (181st day)

First Graduating Class

- First graduating class with 24credits required
- One year of 7-period day
- LWSD enrollment peaks





2020 Lake Washington School District

Pandemic Impacts

- COVID 19 global pandemic disrupts all school operations
- State implements options for credits and pathways to graduation in response
- Enrollment begins to decline



Post Pandemic

- First class of all 7-period day begins school year
- Pandemic recovery
 - School Operations
 - Student Emotional Needs
 - Student Academic Needs
 - Enrollment decline continues

2022 Lake Washington School District

Start Time Work

- Committee convenes to pick up start time work from 2015
- Recommendation to shift start time for HS to 8:30
- Students report sense of overwhelm for workload in data collection
- Enrollment decline continues

2023 Lake Washington School District

Impacts of 7-Period Day

- Committee begins work to evaluate the impact of the 7 Period HS day
- Start time changes implemented
- Enrollment declines continue
- Budget adjustments continue

- District reduces budget largely attrition and shifts to capital expense

- June Oct 2024 Technical workgroup examines options
- October 2024 District to change to 6-Periods
- Community forums held

- Technical group expands to include teachers
- Schedule Rec December
- LWEA request to bargain


HS Day Implementation

- Policy changes initiated
- Student registration begins
- Master schedules built (typical process)

2025

Lake Washington

- Staffing determined by registration (typical process)
- Sept 2025 6-period day begins





The district will expand the number of outside credits that will be accepted and placed on a student's transcript.





The number of credits we will accept from outside sources will be expanding. Details of this policy change will be shared pending board approval and additional work with staff. (Late January)


LWSD will lay off 61.5 high school teachers.

RIF Process in a Nutshell

Order of Operations



Check Endorsement(s) Check Contract Status Determine Seniority

Secondary teachers must have an endorsement to teach the class or classes. Continuing contracts have priority. Provisional contracts are eligible if or when no qualified continuing are in the pool. Most senior qualified person offered the position and has 5 days to accept or pass.







School day will automatically be 20 minutes shorter, same amount added when 7-period day came online.





- Length of day driven by 1027-hour requirement, not number of periods
- Requirement changed in 2015-2016 prior to 7-period day
- LWSD made both adjustments at the same time





Kids from LWSD will be at a competitive disadvantage from other districts for college admissions to elite programs or universities.

- Waive 1.0 PE credit and complete alternative OR could use 4th year of math to make space for 1.0 PE
- Could make room for another CTE course to access graduation pathway option via CTE using 4th year math slot
- Could also use 4th year band to meet OCC Ed credit requirement
- Options are very student dependent

How has the K-12 world changed since 2017?



Students can now be up to 1.6 FTE

- Students can take courses through Running Start get it paid for by the State AND remain a full-time high school student
- Asynchronous / Online Courses (Health, Other, Running Start, Online AP and other courses)
- Credit Retrieval Options
- Cross Crediting
- Organizational Mindset Shift
 - System prioritized 4-year college above other paths
 - Shifting to prioritizing student agency / flexibility
 - Can extend in the ways that make sense for each student
